Cookies and how they benefit you

The WFCDSA website uses cookies, as almost all websites do, to help provide you with the best experience we can. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you browse websites

Our cookies help us:

- Make our website work as you'd expect.
- Improve the speed/security of the site.
- Allow you to share pages with social networks like (but not limited to) Facebook, Twitter and Google+.
- Continuously improve our website for you.

We do not use cookies to:

- Collect any personally identifiable information (without your express permission).
- Pass data to advertising networks.
- Pass personally identifiable data to any third party(s).

Granting us permission to use cookies

The WFCDSA website uses third-party technology which allows you to control how you to choose to grant or refuse permission of the use of cookies. This application can easily be accessed using the 'Cookie settings' tab at the bottom of your display.

If the settings on your software that you are using to view the WFCDSA website (your browser) are adjusted to accept cookies, we take this, and your continued use of our website, to mean that you are fine with our use of cookies. Should you wish to remove or not use cookies from our site, you can learn how to do this below, however doing so will likely mean that our site will not work as you would expect.

Our own cookies

WFCDSA only uses third party cookies on its website in order to make our website more user friendly, and to compile visitor statistics, details of which can be found below.

Social Website Cookies

So you can easily share content from the WFCDSA website, on social media platforms such as (but not limited to) Facebook, Twitter and Google+, we have included sharing buttons on our website.

The cookies for these buttons are set by the individual social media platforms themselves, and the privacy implications will vary from social network to social network, and will depend on the privacy settings you have opted to use on those networks.

Visitor Statistics Cookies

We use cookies to compile visitor statistics, such as how many people have visited our website, what type of technology they are using (e.g. Mac or Windows which helps to identify when our site isn't working as it should for particular technologies), how long they spend on the site, what page they look at etc. This helps us to continuously improve our website. These so called "analytics" programs also tell us how people reached this site (e.g. from a search engine) and whether they have been here before, helping us to put more time into developing our website and services.

The WFCDSA website uses Google Analytics to compile such statistics.

Turning Cookies Off

You can usually switch cookies off by adjusting your browser settings to stop it from accepting cookies. Find out how by visiting <http://www.attacat.co.uk/resources/cookies/how-to-ban> for details of how to do this; doing so however, will likely limit the functionality of ours, and a large proportion of the world's websites, as cookies are a standard part of most modern websites.

It may be that your concerns around cookies relate to so called "spyware". Rather than switching off cookies in your browser, you may find that anti-spyware software achieves the same objective by automatically deleting cookies considered to be invasive.
